Lynn Naden's installation, Spectrum, on display thru Jan 29

Homer multi-media artist Lynn Naden's site-specific installation explores light and spectra on cast paper sculpture. Naden, who has been experimenting with paper sculpture for nearly twenty years, paints her highly textured paper pulp sculptures with gentle light spectra. Naden offers a workshop in conjunction with the exhibition. (See following)

Naden offers cast paper sculpture workshop Jan. 21 and 22



Lynn Naden teaches cast paper sculpting methods in her beautiful studio Friday, Jan. 21st (5 to 8 pm) and Saturday Jan. 22nd (10 to 6 pm). A master mold-builder in many different media, Naden will demonstrate and guide participants in uses of cellulose and fabric fiber pulp to create stable and lightweight sculpture. The workshop will take place in her studio with all materials provided. Minimum 8 participants, Maximum 12. Bring your own lunch. Workshop fee: \$85 general; \$75 Bunnell members.
